1	Why the Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission be consulted on the proposals on the subject of promotion of Government employees in all the Departments?	AS required under Article 320 (3) (b) of Constitution of India
2	What is the relevant provision in the TNPSC Regulations, 1954?	Regulation 16 of the Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission Regulations, 1954.
3	Which kind of posts fall under the purview of Departmental Promotion Committee?	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. The posts for which appointment is to be made by recruitment by transfer from one service to another service.2. The posts for which appointment is to be made from one class to another class under Tamil Nadu General Service.3. The posts for which appointment is to be made by promotion from one category to another and one class to another class of posts in a state service specified in Annexure I-B of the Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission Regulations, 1954.
4	What is the panel year?	The year(s) in which the estimate of vacancy period covered in the 12 months period. eg.1: If the panel period is from 05.03.1994 to 04.03.1995 then the panel year is 1994 to 1995. eg.2: If the panel period is from 01.01.1994 to 31.12.1994 then the panel year is 1994.
5.	What is the Crucial Date ?	It is the date prescribed in the respective service rules to acquire qualifications etc.,
6	what is estimate period?	It is the panel period of 12 months reckoned for the panel year during which the vacancies are to be reckoned for computing the estimate of vacancy. eg.1: 05.03.1994 to 04.03.1995 as shown in Sl.No.4 above.
7	Whether the estimate period is common for all posts?	No. a) For the posts for which the consultation of the Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission, is not required , the estimate period should cover the period of one year from the date following the crucial date prescribed under the special or ad-hoc rules governing the said post.

		b) For the posts for which the consultation of the Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission, is required , the estimate period should cover the period of one year from the date following the due date prescribed for communicating the selected list by the Departmental Promotion Committee as per the orders in para 14A of G.O.Ms.No.603, Personnel and Administrative Reforms Department dated 12.06.1985 as subsequently amended in G.O.Ms.No.97 P&AR Dept. dated 21.04.1994 or thereafter.
8	When the proposal should be sent to DPC?	For the posts which fall under the concerned Administrative Department of the Secretariat, the detailed programme laid down in Annexure 4 under para 14(A) of G.O.Ms.No.603, Personnel and Administrative Reforms Department, dated 12.06.1985 as subsequently amended in G.O.Ms.No.97 Personnel and Administrative Reforms Department, dated 21.04.1994 or thereafter.
9	Whether DPC meeting is required to be convened to consider the cases re-opened for inclusion of name in an approved panel.	It is not necessary to convene the meeting. But all the procedure have to be followed in getting the views of Personnel and Administrative Reforms Department and by sending proposal to Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission to get its concurrence before the proposal is got approved.
10	Whether complete shaped proposals alone will be entertained on the day of single window system or whether clarification can be had on that day?	Clarifications due proposals will be entertained if authorized by the Departmental Officers.
11	In the cases where panel period is over, whether the leave reserve and unexpected contingencies can be taken into account for computing the estimate of vacancy and for drawal of panel?	No. If the panel period is already over at the time of approval of panel, only the actual vacancies that arose due to retirement, promotion ,death, relinquishment and resignation up-to the last date of the panel period alone are to be taken into account for computing the estimate of vacancy as well as for finalizing the panel.
