<p>Q.No. 11</p>	<p>The rise of e-governance mandates a significant shift in public service delivery moving transactions from crowded government offices to digital portals. However, this transformation introduces the challenge of the 'Digital Divide' excluding citizens who lack internet access, devices or digital literacy. To combat this, entities like the Government of Tamil Nadu established e-sevai centers. (Common Service Centers or CSC's). These centers act as the essential physical front-end for online government services providing a vital bridge to digital inclusion.</p> <p>The primary function of the e-sevai centers is to offer a single-window access point for numerous G2C (Government-to-Citizen) services including the application for essential certificates (like income and community), utility bill payments and enrollment in welfare schemes. Staffed by trained personnel-often local entrepreneurs - they guide citizens through complex digital forms, ensuring accuracy and proper submission. By offering proximity and professional assistance these centers effectively transform the civic experience. They reduce the need for expensive, time-consuming travel to distant district offices enhance transparency through standardized pricing and promote accountability by providing trackable digital receipts. Thus, e-sevai centres are crucial institutional innovations that ensure the benefits of digital administration are accessible and equitably distributed across all sections of society.</p>
